This Week's Highlights: Swifts Class

This week Swifts have been learning about habitats. We have talked about our own habitats and those of worms.

Children are beginning to understand that animals including humans have different needs which mean they live in different places.

We have read the story of Superworm and we have made our own wormeries!

In maths we have been learning about partitioning numbers and we have made our own superworms, which represent the different parts of a number.

We have had a very exciting week!




