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Weekly class updates:

This week the Honey Bees have been very creative! We started the week by continuing our fireworks theme from last week. We used cotton buds to make sparkly firework pictures and they looked fantastic! We then moved on to Diwali and practised making patterns with lots of bright colours. We created our own poppy pictures for Remembrance Day and have enjoyed making spotty pictures for Children in Need.

This week Bumblebees have been talking about the different celebrations that take place. We have been learning about 'Diwali', the festival of light and have all made very colourful lanterns which look lovely. We listened to the story about Ramu and Sita and set up a role play area where the children have been having 'Indian tea parties'. We have enjoyed creating Rangoli patterns using beans, lentils, and colourful pasta. Honeybees joined us for a two-minute silence on Remembrance Day which we were amazing at! We have also been celebrating 'Children in Need'.

This week Puffins have been learning about Remembrance Day. We all respected a silence at 11am on the 11th November. The children have been making poppies and counting the materials that they used for Maths. I am super impressed with the mathematical vocabulary that the children are now using. We have also been getting creative and making poppies. The week was finished off with a fun Friday for Children in Need. It has been a fun packed week.

This week Kingfishers have enjoyed learning about Remembrance Day. We have talked about why we celebrate Remembrance Day and why we wear poppies. We have made our own poppy reefs and poppy pictures. We have enjoyed learning a poem called 'Poppy, Poppy'. We have had lots of fun in PE on the apparatus travelling over, under and around the apparatus. Well done Kingfishers.

Swallows have been story detectives this week. They came across a broken bridge, bricks, slime and footprints near the school entrance. We have been discussing writing and contemplating the 'who', 'what' and 'why' questions about our findings. We have since found out that it was the troll from The Three Billy Goats Gruff and have started learning this tradtitional tale. A very exciting week.

As part of Maths week Swifts have been helping Hoppy Bunny to sort all his carrots out! Bunny had ten carrots and has been tricking us by arranging them in different ways. Do you know all of the bonds to ten? We have also had a mysterious visitor, we found a broken bridge and some gigantic footsteps outside on our green, juicy grass...Can you guess who it might have been?

This week Owls have had a wonderful week enjoying their new story 'The Gingerbread man'. They have begun to learn the story with actions and pictures. On Tuesday they enjoyed designing and tasting their very own yummy gingerbread man. We have also explored Remembrance Day and spent time reflecting on those who have helped us in our lives. We also celebrated Diwali and made our very own Diya lamps.

Skylarks have been immersed into the story of The Gingerbread Man. We had a very exciting day dressed as traditional tale characters, decorating gingerbread and character spotting in scenes from Shrek. We have learnt a version of the story with actions which we will share with you all soon. We are becoming more confident using a number line to add and subtract. We took part in the 2 minute silence for remembrance and also created poppies.

Robins have had a fantastic week, starting their new topic 'Once upon a time.' On Tuesday the children enjoyed a brilliant WOW day, where they dressed up, decorated gingerbread men, made wanted posters and took part in some outdoor team work activities. You are strongly advised to name **three** preferences on the application form. **Naming a second or third preference does not give you any less chance of getting a place at your preferred school.** When making your decision you should...

...think about how you will get your child to school. Go to www.cornwall.gov.uk/schooltransport for more information on whether your child would be entitled to transport to school.

...look at the **admission arrangements** on our website that will be used to allocate places for each school.

...consider naming your **nearest or designated school** as one of your preferences. You can find your nearest or designated school on our website.

...look at the detailed **admissions information** on our website, also available on request.

2 Submit your application by 15 January 2021

3 Wait to find out which school you have been allocated

If you applied on time you will be notified of your allocation on **National Offer**Day: 16 April 2021. Apply on time! Late applications will only be dealt with after National Offer Day and there may not be any places left at your preferred schools.

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
