What a brilliant first week back we have had! We were so pleased to welcome back so many smiley faces on Monday. This week Honey Bees have been busy looking at fireworks. They have made some super pictures using chalks and paints and have also been busy exploring lots of sparkles in the water tray and the playdough. This week Bumblebees have been learning all about Guy Fawkes Night. We have made some lovely fireworks pictures using marbles, paint and black card. We also watched a firework display on the whiteboard and pretended to be fireworks using different movements and sounds. We have been doing lots of counting and number rhymes such as 'Five Little Ducks' and Five Speckled Frogs' using finger puppets.

Puffins have had an exciting week taking part in lots of different Halloween activities. All the children looked great in their Halloween-coloured outfits. We have been making silly soup in Literacy and writing our ingredients. We have been learning different shapes in Maths and have had lots of fun going on shape hunts.

Kingfishers have had a super week celebrating Halloween. They enjoyed dressing up in autumnal/Halloween colours and spending the week exploring all things Halloween and pumpkins. They have made their own Halloween pictures and enjoyed our story pumpkin soup.

Swallows have been listening to and watching firework displays. They have generated wonderful words to describe the sights, sounds and tastes of bonfire night. They listened to and acted out bonfire poems, using their imaginations to act out the descriptive writing. The descriptive words were used to make their own Bonfire night poems that were displayed with brilliant and bright firework pictures they made in class. Well done Swallows for all your creativity and imagination this week.

Swifts Class have been exploring the theme of fireworks this week. We have been listening to Handel and whizzing and twirling around the hall in PE. In Maths we have ordered numbers counted backwards to launch rockets and in Literacy we have written about al things dazzling!

What a lovely first week back Owls have had after half term, we really enjoyed our history lessons, discovering facts about Guy Fawkes, we even had a visit from Guy Fawkes himself. We explored poems about fireworks, looking at all of the exciting language before we created our own. In maths we continued to develop our addition and subtraction skills buy adding in ones and tens.

This week Skylarks have been focussing on a range of strategies to help with addition and subtraction. We have been continuing to embed pairs of numbers that make 10 and use this for more complicated number problems. We've had a week of firework poetry, exploring the sights and sounds and have each produced an excellent firework poem, as well as learning the history behind bonfire night.

Robins have had a great first week back from half term, working to improve our poetry telling skills, as well as writing our own poems on a Firework theme. In maths we have been adding and subtracting numbers up to 100, with some really impressive speedy answers when adding ten to any given number. We have moved indoors for our P.E. lessons, starting a new unit of gymnastics. Why not ask you child to show off some of the key skills we were practicing, such as a side support or half lever. The children have come back with great enthusiasm. Fantastic!

You will need to apply even if your child attends a school's nursery or pre-school class. Please note that if a school is oversubscribed the fact that a child attends a school's nursery or pre-school, or a local nursery or pre-school, does not automatically guarantee a place at that school. You are strongly advised to name **three** preferences on the application form. **Naming a second or third preference does not give you any less chance of getting a place at your preferred school.** When making your decision you should...

...think about how you will get your child to school. Go to www.cornwall.gov.uk/schooltransport for more information on whether your child would be entitled to transport to school.

...look at the **admission arrangements** on our website that will be used to allocate places for each school.

...consider naming your **nearest or designated school** as one of your preferences. You can find your nearest or designated school on our website.

...look at the detailed **admissions information** on our website, also available on request.
