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Weekly class updates:

This week Honeybees have been getting into the Christmas spirit! We worked together to decorate our Christmas tree and have been busy making Christmas crafts. Outdoors we have even been playing in snow! We are getting very good at singing our Christmas songs and can't wait to share them with you on Tapestry near the end of term.

This week Bumblebees have had a surprise visitor in the Nursery! A cheeky elf has arrived and getting up to all sorts of mischief! We have made some lovely tree decorations and talking about making choices between the shape and colours we like. We have been learning the words and actions for our Christmas Sing-a-Long and getting very good now. We have also continued to practice pencil control and recognising and having a go at writing our names.

This week in Puffin's we have continued from learning 'one more' in Maths to learning 'one less' than a given number. The children have worked hard and used lots of different resources to support them. In Literacy we have been learning about 'The Gruffalo's child' The children have enjoyed learning about the different characters in the story.

This week in Kingfishers we have been focussing on the story of The Gruffalos Child. We have painted our own woodland animals, thinking about their size, shape and colour. We have enjoyed rhyming games and matching rhyming words and finding rhyming words within the story. We have enjoyed making Gruffalo caves using a range of materials and constructions sets. We had to build one which would be strong enough to stand up.

Swallows have been very busy in maths this week. They have been investigating addition and subtraction using number lines, part whole models and word problems. They have been challenged to read, write and order numbers in varied sequences and read and write number words. This week they also began investigating tens and ones using practical resources in two-digit numbers under 20. They have enjoyed the challenge of learning new concepts in maths.

We are so proud of the children who have reached the sunshine for exceptional kindness, behaviour or friendliness to others. You are an exceptional role model to others. Well done!

This week Swifts have been partitioning into 10's and 1's - look out for some in your local environment. What number house do you live at? We have also been investigating materials and designing bridges which could hold some characters! We had some interesting designs.

Owls Class have enjoyed a busy week and have all continued to work very hard. In maths the children have been learning how to subtract two 2-digit numbers and in Literacy our focus has been on learning to write instructions. They have especially enjoyed following a set of instructions to make an origami boat. They were very good at using bossy verbs too! Our topic work has been focussed on The Great Fire of London. In history they have completed a timeline of key events and in science they have been making boats to escape The Great Fire of London, using a range of different materials. We have experienced a little bit of chaos in class however with the arrival of our naughty Elf. Much to the children's delight, he has been causing havoc!

We have started to learn about money this week in Skylarks. We have been identifying how much each coin and note is worth and finding totals for a mixture of coins. We tried to imagine what it was like for people living through the Great Fire of London in 1666 by writing a diary entry. Also, we have been posing questions to investigate about materials and how they are affected by heat and fire. We filled our marble jar for the second time and enjoyed a pyjama day as a reward. Thankfully, no one fell asleep!

This week in Robins we have really enjoyed getting stuck in to learning more about The Great Fire of London. We found out that many people escaped by boat on the River Thames, so following some investigation into materials, we designed our own boats and tested how well they would float. We have created our own gymnastic routines, including a range of skills we have learned over the previous weeks. Next week we are going to perfect these routines, before performing them to the class!
