A message from Mrs French

Last week I shared messages about maintaining social distancing and about parking outside of school.

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Weekly class updates:

This week Honey Bees have been busy sorting and identifying colours. We have enjoyed making pictures by fruit and vegetable printing and singing our 'Thankyou farmer' song to celebrate harvest. Great job HoneyBees!

This week Bumblebees have been talking about harvest time and have been listening and acting out the story of 'The Little Red Hen' in their play. We have used fruit & vegetables to create face pictures, choosing the appropriate colours and shapes for their features. We have had great fun learning the song 'I'm a dingle dangle scarecrow' which we filmed and put on Tapestry.

What a lovely week we've had in puffins. We have worked hard to practise counting and comparing different amounts. We have also learnt new sounds and are beginning to read simple CVC words. It's so lovely to see the progress the children are making. I would love to see what the children are learning at home. Please don't forget to post on tapestry.

Kingfishers have had a super week despite all the rain. We have continued learning lots in our outside area. We are impressed how many children are engaging in stories in our book boats outside. In maths, we have been comparing amounts using the vocabulary of 'more' and ' fewer than'. The children are working very hard learning a new sound every day. We are now learning to read simple words using the sounds taught. Well done Kingfishers.

Swallows have been writing about being superheroes this week. They have been thinking imaginatively about which superpowers they would have, which animals they may be and where they may go. Their writing has shown wonderful creativity and imaginative ideas with good attention to capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Miss Debes is very proud of their efforts.

We are so proud of the children who have reached the sunshine for exceptional kindness, behaviour or friendliness to others.

You are an exceptional role model to others. Well done!

This week Swifts read the book 'Kind' by Axel Scheffler. We have been thinking about ways we can show kindness to each other and thinking about our similarities and differences. We have been learning that different people have different needs, likes and dislikes. There has been lots of discussion about ways we can act with understanding and kindness. Have you read any books about friends and kindness lately?

Owls have really enjoyed investigating the habitats of penguins and polar bears. We have looked at the different reasons as to why animals are suited to where they live. In maths we have started to learn about addition and subtraction. The children enjoyed using a range of resources to independently solve addition problems and check their answers. Another great week Owls, well done.

Skylarks have continued to learn about habitats and what makes animals suited to the habitat they live in. We've learned about how to write a non chronological report full of facts and description. In maths, we have been recognising the links between addition and subtraction and using this relationship to check answers. We also looked at the fourth pillar of Islam, Ramadan and how Muslims celebrate Eid.

This week in Robins we have become experts in counting in 2s, 5s and 10s! We found that there are numbers that aren't in any of those sequences, whilst some numbers appear in all of them, such as twenty. We have also been focusing on the use of 'but' when writing sentences, using it to compare different animals in contrasting habitats, as well as thinking of amazing adjectives to really bring our writing to life, such as when describing powerful polar bears or long, squirmy worms. The whole class have impressed us with great questioning about their learning and some superb home learning going on as well. Brilliant!
