Keeping in touch and home learning

We are pleased to be able to let you know that pastoral meetings will now be arranged weekly (not during half term week 15th—19th Feb). These are an important way for the children to keep in touch with their peers and teachers.

Laptops available

We have now received four reconditioned laptops from 'Reboot'. If you are finding it challenging to engage with some of the online tasks please contact the school and we will be able to issue you with one of these laptops subject to availability.

Aspire academies will be closed to ALL pupils, including critical workers/vulnerable pupils, on Friday 12th February for a planned Trust INSET staff training day. INSET days are established diary dates in any given academic year and the Trust has retained this date to ensure professional development and teaching & learning best practice continues across all our academies. Academies will then remain closed to ALL pupils from w/c 15th February for half term and will reopen to critical worker/vulnerable pupils on Monday 22nd February. Eligible Free School Meals families will receive a Wonde voucher to cover the half term

We hope you have a restful week's break - stay safe everybody.

Keyworkers

We strongly advise that parents/carers DO NOT use a critical worker place if there is another adult at home, even if you are entitled to. The national lockdown is intended to minimise community transmission. It will not do this if parents send their children to school just because they can.

Critical worker provision is ONLY for parents who have NO OTHER CHILDCARE OPTION. Using this provision if another option is available will mean that someone who is in need may be struggling to provide care for their child. It also means it will take longer for us to come out of lockdown, as transmission will be higher than it needs to be.

Parents are asked to consider others and ONLY use their local school service if it is imperative to do so.
