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Weekly class update.....

Honey Bees have had another super week and we are so proud of how well all of the children have settled. This week we have been looking at the colour blue. The children have enjoyed lots of play with blue water and have been busy making blue handprints! Our song this week has been "I have a tiny turtle" and the children have been joining in with a loud 'pop' at the end. We're look forward to exploring the colour red next week!

Bumblebees have been listening to the story 'Funnybones'. We have been looking at our bodies and working out which bones are which. We drew around each other and put the bones in all the right places! We have also been looking at the colour green and square shapes. We went on a walk in the garden searching for squares and found lots. The children are also learning to recognise their names and have a go at writing them. Well done Bumblebees!

This week Puffins have been continuing to learn the Elmer story. They have been using a story map to help them retell the story. The children have been designing their own Elmer elephants and using lots of bright colours. They particularly enjoyed collaging in Art. The children are nicely settled into full time school now and making great progress already.

This week in Kingfishers Class we have been talking about who is special to us and who helps us both at home and in school, all the children shared their ideas together as a class. We have also enjoyed our maths learning, where we have painted our own number lines, sorted shapes and learnt lots of new numbers. Well done Kingfishers!

Swallows have been having fantastic fun in P.E this week. They have been playing invasion games and learning how to be a good defender when an opponent is trying to either score a goal or throw a beanbag in their hoop. They have been sharing ideas about good tactics when both defending and aiming at targets, 'tricking' the defender. They have had wonderful fun in team games together using skills of tactics, aiming and defending into practise.

Swifts' Class have been using mathematical vocabulary to describe quantities. We have been using greater than, less than, fewer and most. Can you think of a way to use this language over the weekend? We have also been retelling our story, "In My Heart". Lots of us are brilliant at remembering the whole story with actions. Maybe you could have a bedtime story retell at your home?

Owls enjoyed writing their own version of our class text this week. We used lots of adjectives, speech, verbs, and adverbs to improve our story. We have explored our school habitat. We discovered lots of bugs, creepy crawlies, and a huge variety of plants on our new school field.

Skylarks have been working incredibly hard, writing their own version of the story that we have been learning. They have innovated the story to include different characters and different magical objects. We have started practising counting in 2s and 5s and next week, we'll be looking at counting in 3s. As well as this, we've made miniature habitats, considered what is important to Muslims and role played what to do if you see someone being unkind to another person. What a busy week!

This week has been a great week for Robins! Recently we have spent a lot of time learning the story of Almost Anything, with the children becoming superb storytellers to recite the story by following our story map. This week the children have innovated the story, changing some of the characters and events to create their own version, which they have been busy writing up each day. We have both been really impressed by their enthusiasm throughout and the lovely stories they have produced. To finish the week, we have started to investigate habitats around us, creating a habitat in a shoe box that a small creature may enjoy living in.
